South Boston homeowners invited to free MBHP mortgage assistance workshop

SOUTH BOSTON – South Boston residents experiencing problems meeting their mortgage obligations are invited to a workshop that could help them get back on track.

The Metropolitan Boston Housing Partnership, in cooperation Boston's Department of Neighborhood Services, will conduct a free mortgage workshop from 6 to 8 p.m. Monday, March 22, at the South Boston Public Library, 646 East Broadway St.

The workshop is designed to assist homeowners in one or more of the following circumstances:

- They are concerned about losing their home to foreclosure.
- They are unable to "keep up" with their mortgage payments or bring their loans up to date.
- They are experiencing issues or complications working with their lenders.
- They have received notification from their lenders or a law firm threatening foreclosure.

MBHP foreclosure prevention specialists will help workshop attendees evaluate their individual circumstances, understand their options, and formulate action plans to help save their homes and improve their credit situations.

Additionally, MBHP foreclosure prevention specialists may be able to help workshop attendees modify their mortgage terms by reducing their interest rates, resulting in more manageable monthly payments, and in some cases postpone scheduled foreclosure auctions.

Attendees do not have to be late on their mortgage payments or in foreclosure to attend this free workshop.
